Part of our mission is to care for animals, all animals, through veterinary care for the sick and injured; providing a warm, safe place for the homeless and to ultimately provide quality pet adoptions for all animals.

We are a not-for profit 501 (c) (3) organization in Pennsylvania and are not run by Warren County. We want to make sure our NEW name reflects all the good works we do for the animals. Even though we are not run by the county we are still an important part of Warren County. Just imagine if there was no place for the lost, sick, injured and homeless animals???

The final name will be decided by the Board of Directors of the Humane Society. If there is a duplicate entry, the first one received will be judged.
